We had a respiratory therapist named Wendy who was also great, she calmed my son down when he was going onto the high oxygen. They also helped calm him down when the decision was made to transport him to Mass General by helicopter. My son has made a complete recovery and has mentioned to me how much it meant to him that Exeter was there for him when he needed them. Thank you."

"The number of patients who come to the Emergency Department needing behavioral health care or in mental health crisis has risen significantly over the last several years. In the last two years, the pandemic has made this even worse, and this increased need has been especially pronounced with children and adolescents. Many of these patients require care in an inpatient psychiatric hospital, but the number of available inpatient beds is nowhere near enough to meet the need, so patients wait in local hospital emergency departments. We routinely have multiple patients waiting days and days in our ED for an inpatient bed somewhere. Our providers and staff do an incredible job taking care of these patients the best that they can, but the ED is far from the ideal place to be stuck for days, weeks or sometimes even months if you are experiencing a mental health crisis, especially if you are a child or a teenager."
